

Catechesis and Confirmation: It's About Forming Christ-Followers

Confirmation is not just an academic process or a requirement for membership in God's Kingdom. It's about forming Christ-followers. Confirmation at Faith Lutheran Church is a carefully designed program - one that is intended to bring youth to a closer understanding of God's Word, their Savior Jesus Christ, and the Church as a whole.

Objectives

7th and 8th grade students will become familiar with Lutheran teaching and understanding of Scripture and be able to articulate their faith in Christ. This will be achieved through faithful worship, study, service, engagement with core concepts, as well as encouragement from parents, pastors, leaders and peers.

Requirements

- Regular worship and class attendance, as well as attendance at the fall retreat.
- A solid understanding of the "Six Chief Parts" of the Small Catechism.
 - O Each student is asked to demonstrate their understanding of basic Christianity by **sharing the**Six Chief Parts and Luther's explanations.
 - O When a student is ready to be examined, he/she should make an appointment with a pastor or the Director of Youth and Education. This demonstration of proficiency can be conducted through a combination of written and oral forms at the leader's discretion.
- Each student is required to discuss each week's themes with his/her family (see extended schedule for weekly family discussion topics.

• Completion of Sermon Notes (18 per year)

- o Forms are provided on the bookshelves near the south entrance to the Sanctuary. Apply what you learn from the Catechism to listen for the Law and Gospel being delivered in the sermon.
- OR You may have up to 9 notes substituted each year by participating in worship service opportunities. These can include serving as acolyte, usher, reader, A/V assistant, or for leading your family in worship at home. It's up to you to arrange for these opportunities. To receive credit fill out the backside of a sermon note.
- When all other requirements have been met, students will <u>design a 'statement of faith'</u> in which they not only demonstrate their knowledge of Lutheran doctrine, but apply it to their own lives. Guidelines for completion will be presented at the class retreat.
